Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulation

The Nevada Department of Education is proposing regulation language pertaining to the Nevada Administrative Code. The Workshop has been scheduled for **December 14, 2015** via video conference at the following locations: **Nevada Department of Education Offices, Board Conference Room, 700 East Fifth Street, Board Room, Carson City and 9890 South Maryland Parkway, 2nd Floor Board Conference Room, Las Vegas, Nevada.** The purpose of the Workshop is to solicit comments from interested person on the following general topics to be addressed in a proposed regulation:

Workshop to Solicit Comments on new Proposed Amendments to NAC 391 related to the statewide performance evaluation system for school level administrators and teachers, and Proposed Amendments to NAC 391.571 Performance evaluation of school-level and probationary administrators: Required domains; NAC 391.572 Performance evaluation of school-level administrator in domain of instructional leadership practices; NAC 391.573 Performance evaluation of school-level administrator in domain of professional responsibilities; NAC 391.574 Performance evaluation of teacher: Required domains; NAC 391.575 Performance evaluation of teacher in domain of instructional practices, NAC 391.576 Performance evaluation of teacher in domain of professional responsibilities, and NAC 391.578 Department to prescribe data used to measure performance of school-level administrators and teachers in domain of performance of pupils; authority to differentiate between teachers.

Re: Proposed amendments to NAC 391.571 – NAC 391.578 regarding teacher and administrator evaluations

I, Dena Durish, Deputy Superintendent of Educator Effectiveness and Family Engagement, do hereby certify that, to the best of my knowledge or belief:

1. The proposed permanent regulation additions to NAC 391 and amendments to NAC 391.571 – NAC 391.578 are not likely to (a) impose a direct or significant economic burden upon a small business, or (b) directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business. The proposed regulations deal only with teacher and administrator evaluation.
2. A concerted effort was made to determine any economic burden.
3. All relevant materials were reviewed and the Department considered its history with implementing similar regulations; the proposed changes are within the historic scope of the Department's activities and present no new cost of enforcement.
4. Comment has not been solicited from small businesses, and no summary of their response is provided, because small businesses are not impacted by this regulation and thus no burden or economic impact can be assessed.
