If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Commission on Professional Standards in Education may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

The need and the purpose of the proposed amendments is to separate the elementary physical education licensure from the elementary education licensure regulations. This in an effort to strengthen the physical education requirements and qualifications for those schools who have separate physical education teachers for elementary by developing a K-8 physical education license. The purpose of the proposed amendments is also to ensure that no matter who has a current approved program, they have to review the approved program to make sure that the proposed coursework is included in their program.

There is no economic effect of the regulation on the public. There are no adverse effects. There are no immediate or long-term effects on the public. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation is none.
