I, Steve Canavero, being the duly appointed Superintendent of Public Instruction of the Nevada Department of Education, do hereby certify that, to the best of my knowledge or belief:

1. The proposed new amendments to revise NRS Chapter 389 concerning the proposed additions to the Nevada Academic Content Standards for Health are not likely to (a) impose a direct or significant economic burden upon a small business, or (b) directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business.

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulation

The Nevada Department of Education is proposing regulation language pertaining to the Nevada Administrative Code. The Workshop has been scheduled for **October 26, 2017** via video conference at the following locations: **Nevada Department of Education Offices, Board Conference Room, 700 East Fifth Street, Board Room, Carson City and 9890 South Maryland Parkway, 2nd Floor Board Conference Room, Las Vegas, Nevada.** The purpose of the Workshop is to solicit comments from interested person on the following general topics to be addressed in a proposed regulation:

9:30 A.M. Workshop to solicit comments on proposed amendments to NAC Chapter 389, relating to the standards of instruction in the content area of health. The proposed amendments revise the language in NAC 389.2423 Grades Pre-Kindergarten through 2nd grade, NAC 389.2938 Grades 3 through 5, NAC 389.381 Grades 6 through 8, NAC 389.455 Grades 9 through 12, to reflect the inclusion of instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator Students, as required in Assembly Bill 85 (Chapter 389, Statutes of Nevada, 2017).

Proposed amendments to the Nevada Academic Content Standards for Health

The proposed changes regarding the health content area will revise the language in NAC 389.2423 (Pre-Kindergarten through 2nd grade), NAC 389.2938 (3rd through 5th grades), NAC 389.381 (6th through 8th grades), NAC 389.455 (high school), to reflect the inclusion of instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator for students.

These proposed additions to the Nevada Academic Content Standards for Health (NVACS-Health) reflect work done regarding health instruction. These proposed additions highlight the work done by the Assembly Committee on Health and Human Services, specifically Assemblypersons Sprinkle (chair), Joiner (vice chair), Benitez-Thompson, Carrillo, McCurdy II, Edwards, Hambrick, Oscarson, Miller, Thompson, Titus, and Yeager. These proposed additions to NVACS-Health address the following:

- The administration of hands-only or compression-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including a psychomotor skill-based component, according to the guidelines of the American Red Cross or American Heart Association
- The use of an automated external defibrillator
- Certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation: Establishment and submission of plan for training; requirements of plan; certain educational personnel required to establish and maintain certification; agreement to provide training (NRS. 391.092)
